Staying connected takes resources, and we are building this work carefully, transparently, and with dignity.

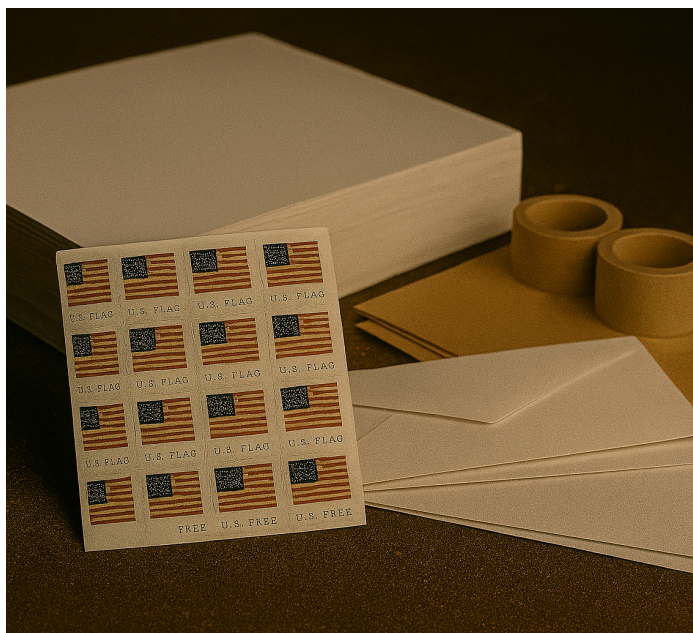
HOW YOU CAN HELP
